 - a. Young Democratic Socialists of America New Club, Amber Olin; Val Davids, Student Leadership and Engagement Center Coordinator
 - i. Val Davids shared that the purpose of the Young Democratic Socialists of America as a club on campus is to pursue and promote a democratic socialist's education for members. As well as provide a space for members to practice democratic engagement while providing support, advocacy, and education.
 - 1. Amber Olin shared that the YDSA club currently has 12 official members, with 68 people on the club mailing list and more than 12 attendees at meetings. Their tabling events have resulted in an average of 17 new sign-ups per event. Senator Saunders asked about upcoming club events. Amber shared that the club has already hosted several socials and is planning campaigns focused on textbook access and affordability while promoting open educational resources. They are also looking to partner with on-campus resources, including Benny's Pantry, for volunteer opportunities and food drives. Additionally, the club is collaborating with the community chapter, Southeast Idaho YDSA, to support a

boycott campaign related to Palestine issues. Senator Vargas Barbosa asked whether there is a membership fee for the club. Amber shared that if the club becomes a nationally recognized organization, there would be chapter dues; however, all students are welcome to attend social events regardless of membership status.

- b. Turning Point USA Club Reactivation, Trevor Hammond; Val Davids, Student Leadership and Engagement Center Coordinator
 - i. Val Davids shared that Turning Point USA has been inactive on campus for the past tow years but had been active on campus since 2017 before that. Currently they have 8 members, but that number is expected to continue to grow.
 - Trevor Hammond, President of the Turning Point USA club, shared an overview of the club, which focuses on promoting free speech, open and honest debate, the Constitution, and conservative values. The club is nonpartisan and does not require any voter registration to join. There has been strong interest in the club, with approximately 30 to 40 members on the college roster and around 50 affiliated with the national Turning Point organization. While the club has not yet hosted many events, they recently held a watch party for Charlie Kirk's Medal of Honor event, which drew 15 to 16 attendees despite being organized on short notice. The club's primary goal is to get people talking and bring students together around shared discussions and activities.
