STUDENT AFFAIRS COUNSELING LEADING TO THE DEGREE MASTER OF COUNSELING (M.COUN.)

The masters of counseling specialty practice area in Student Affairs Counseling is designed to provide a comprehensive view of college student services and prepare the student to work in at least two student affairs positions. In addition to the higher education/development emphasis, the graduate student receives a strong component in effective communication skills which are essential for the student affairs administrator in any setting. The didactic and experiential aspects of the program are joined in at least one counseling practicum and in student affairs internships appropriate to the student's post-degree professional goals.

A. **General Residency Requirement.** For the Master of Counseling (M.COUN.) specialty practice area, the student is required to complete the equivalent of at least four full semesters of resident graduate study beyond the bachelor's degree. The minimum Student Affairs Counseling program must total 60 semester hours.
