





- Grand Opening of Community Psychiatric Center on October 24, 2024
- The opening of the center comes in response to the continuous need for mental health providers in Southeast Idaho and beyond.

- Some of the services included are:
 - Psychiatric Evaluations: comprehensive assessments of a patient's mental health, including history, symptoms, and potential underlying causes. These evaluations help in diagnosis and treatment planning.
 - Medication Therapy Management: MTM allows psychiatrists to prescribe and manage medication for mental health conditions, such as antidepressants, antipsychotics, and mood stabilizers. Medication management involves regular monitoring and adjustments as needed.

- ISU Masters of Science in Clinical Psychopharmacology (MSCP) program connects Navy officer psychologists to advanced mental health training, bridging military and civilian education.

- Idaho State University and Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine will sign an agreement on January 31, 2025 at 10:00 am solidifying a research partnership between the two institutions.
- The agreement includes providing ISU affiliate faculty status to ICOM faculty to conduct research, and ICOM faculty status to ISU faculty as well. The agreement will allow for increased health care-related research and funding opportunities at both institutions.



- CSI and ISU leadership teams from both institutions signed an updated Memorandum of Understanding that includes:
 - Seamless pathways for students to receive educational opportunities from both CSI and ISU in the fields of education, health care and engineering
 - Expanding nursing and medical lab science programs in Twin Falls to meet growing health care needs





- Streamlining academic and advising support
- Expansion of the PaCT program, which allows paraprofessional educators to earn bachelor degrees and teaching certificates
- ISU and CSI are committed to exploring additional academic opportunities that meet the unique and growing workforce needs of Magic Valley.
