9) Continuing Business

- a) Update on the move of Faculty Senate so that NASS can take over Rendezvous 301 and 340
 - i) Facilities Council is having a very difficult time finding a space that can accommodate the size and needs of Faculty Senate
 - ii) Temporary solution
 - (1) Proposed space is the Sargant Board Room in SUB
 - (a) This is ASISU's meeting space
 - (b) Board Room is very transparent
 - (c) Table seats 24 and has room for 20 additional people behind the tables
 - (d) Room has very good technology- even better than what is available in Rendezvous 340

- b) Surveys to evaluate deans, directors and department chairs- Discussion
 - i) Faculty fear of retaliation
 - (1) Stoutenborough expressed fear of retaliation
 - (a) Also stated that there is a feeling that when suggestions for change or complaints are expressed, nothing is done about it
 - (2) Baxter sees two major issues
 - (a) Haven't had consistent requests for evaluation, so evaluations should be consistent in all colleges
 - (b) Surveys aren't truly anonymous and therefore do not instill trust.

<u>ACTION-</u> Dale motioned that ISU Faculty Senate request the Office of the Ombuds explore the issues of distrust between the ISU faculty and the ISU administration and report their findings to the Faculty Senate and President Satterlee by the April 11, 2022 Faculty Senate Meeting. The purpose of this report is to initiate cooperative discussion to improve intuitional trust.
