### 8) Report from the President's Office - Ryan Sargent - 20:30

- a) ISU was held harmless by the Legislature
- b) Funding requests
  - i) Permanent Building Fund
    - (1) Request for \$14 mil for Life Sciences building and other money for maintenance
  - ii) Two funding bills
    - (1) Base budget passed by JFAC
    - (2) Enhancement trailer bill failed including acquiring ICOM
    - (3) Additional \$15 mill proposed by the governor's office failed
    - (4) Enhancement trailer bill included ISU to acquire ICOM
- c) Medical Education bill manage medical education undergrad programs through the SBOE
- d) SB1198 Higher Education, DEI bill passed and signed by the Governor
- e) Other bills passed impacting education
  - i) House bill 59 Medical ethics defense act (impact for students)
  - ii) House bill 93 Idaho parental Choice tax credit (vouchers for K-12)
  - iii) Campus Free Speech bill

#### 9) Academic Affairs/Provost report- Laura Ahola-Young/Adam Bradford - 39:30



- a) The Provost offered assurances that the Office of Academic Affairs will be working with the SBOE to evaluate how to respond to the new SB1998 Legislation
- b) Provost will attend SBOE meeting tomorrow with other Provosts and General Counsel
- c) Institutions want to move in collective fashion and be unified as to their objectives
- d) Congratulations on Distinguished Faculty Awards
- e) Routine check of federal database to keep track of international students

### 10) GERC report - Ed Kammerer - 56:00

- a) Approval of courses and assessment plans
- b) Currently reviewing annual reports for Objectives 1-4 and 7-9; and the 5-year reports for Objectives 5 and 6
- c) Implementing an easier assessment process, including possible training for faculty
- d) Question of continued existence of Objective 9 'Cultural Diversity' and other objectives with DEI language
- e) 'Durable skills' potential changes from the SBOE mandating Objectives 1-6 be assessed
- f) Possible implementation of themed or linked gen ed courses, surveying faculty for feedback
- g) Issue with some departments not turning in assessments and how to incentivize
- h) Ongoing challenge getting assessment specifics from ECP teachers (in the high schools) for gen ed data
- i) Potential change in GERC structure
  - i) Make into a council and have it report to FS directly instead of UCC
  - ii) Need long-term, consistent leadership for ease of reporting/assessment. Currently, chair position is a 1-year term
- j) GERC is considering limiting the number of gen eds with the same prefixes that a student can take in order to expand their Liberal Arts foundation

<u>ACTION</u> – Bob Houghton motioned for the FS to move GERC from under UCC, making it a separate council that reports directly to FS and asking GERC and UCC to update their bylaws Suzanne Beasterfield seconded

Motion carried with 19 yes, 0 no, 1 abstention

- a) In response to Idaho Senate Bill 1198
  - i) Open discussion held regarding the potential to draft a statement in support of academic freedom
    - (1) Meeting with the Provost discussed drafting a joint statement with Academic Affairs
    - (2) Discussion of statement being directed toward what kind of audience
      - (a) The SBOE part of the Executive branch, they should maintain curriculum and curricular standards. The Legislature is overreaching into Executive Power
      - (b) The Governor ask him to exercise his Executive Authority to rescind the bill and empower the SBOE to be the decision makers at the state level
    - (3) FS Chair meeting with faculty senate chairs of other Idaho institutions
      - (a) Discussion of releasing a joint statement
      - (b) Agreed to release statements from each institution independently
    - (4) Citing ISUPP 4040 'Academic Freedom'
    - (5) Focus on highlighting the contradictory or problematic wording in the bill
    - (6) Question of meeting with other stakeholders (ASISU, Staff Council etc.) for feedback
  - ii) Create a statement in support of our International Faculty and Students
    - (1) FS suggested language for content, purpose and form and other parameters to draft
  - iii) Documents in GoogleDocs, open to all who want to assist with drafting these statements
