This course enhances classroom teaching effectiveness and supports improved student outcomes by introducing new knowledge in fostering and sustaining meaningful, inclusive, and student-centered classroom discussions across subjects.

Course Objectives

- 6. Create a classroom environment that fosters equity, empathy, and critical conversations on social justice.
- 7. Incorporate drama, improv, and alternative communication methods to encourage student voice and self-expression.
- 8. Apply techniques to sustain ongoing, meaningful, and student-centered discussions throughout the school year.
