5. Design assessments that accommodate various learning styles, ensuring that all students have equitable opportunities to demonstrate their understanding.
6. Identify and integrate appropriate assistive technologies to support diverse learners in any learning environment.
7. Understand how to create flexible learning pathways that allow students to progress through the course content at their own pace, accommodating individual learning needs and preferences.
8. Create lesson plans that demonstrate diverse instructional delivery methods, effectively addressing varied learning needs within any learning environment.
