NURS 6611L Advanced Health Assessment (144 hours)

- Demonstrate competency with physical assessment techniques and other laboratory and diagnostic testing.
- Collect, organize and record pertinent data regarding an individual's health status and demonstrate critical reasoning in the systematic use of the data in an advanced level clinical decision-making process for the individual patient.
- Describe the role of the advanced practice nurse in identifying disease states, health education, and health promotion.

Placements: primary care, physical therapy, correctional facility

NURS 6642L Primary Care of the Adult I (144 hours)

- Assess, diagnose, plan, implement, and evaluate health care needs with a focus on young adult.
- Assess and diagnose the health problems that are commonly seen in young adults.
- Manage the health problems commonly experienced in young adults using pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic therapeutic modalities.
- Collaborate and refer to other health providers as indicated
- Critique the FNP role as a primary health care provider within clinical setting

Placements: primary care, correctional facility, public health, women's health, men's health

NURS 6643L Primary Care of Child & Adolescent Lab (96 hours)

- Assess, diagnose, plan, implement, and evaluate the health care needs with a focus on children and adolescents.
- Assess and diagnose the health problems that are commonly seen in the children and adolescents.
- Manage the health problems commonly experienced in the children and adolescents using pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic therapeutic modalities.
- Collaborate and refer to other health providers as indicated
- Critique the FNP role as a primary health care provider within clinical settings

Placements: primary care, pediatrics

NURS 6644L Primary Care of the Adult II (96 hours)

- Assess, diagnose, plan, implement, and evaluate health care needs with a focus on middle and older adults.
- Assess and diagnose the health problems that are commonly seen in middle and older adults.
- Manage the health problems commonly experienced in middle and older adults using pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic therapeutic modalities.

- Collaborate and refer to other health providers as indicated.
- Critique the FNP role as a primary health care provider within clinical settings

Placements: primary care, internal medicine, correctional facility, public health, women's health, men's health

NURS 7740L Primary Care Throughout the Lifespan (240 hours)

- Assess, diagnose, plan, implement, and evaluate health care needs with a focus on the complex patient and special populations.
- Assess and diagnose the complex health problems that are commonly seen in the primary care setting.
- Manage the complex health problems commonly experienced using pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic therapeutic modalities.
- Collaborate and refer to other health care providers as indicated
- Critique the FNP role as a primary health care provider within clinical settings.

Placements: primary care, correctional facility, public health, women's health, men's health, emergency room, urgent care, specialty rotation (dermatology, cardiology, pulmonology, orthopedics, urology/nephrology, endocrinology, behavioral health)

NURS 7780L FNP Practicum (288 hours) (Total Program Clinical Hours: 1008)

- Assess, diagnose, evaluate, plan, implement, and treat health care needs with a focus on family populations
- Assess and diagnose the health problems that are commonly seen in family practice. Manage the health problems commonly experienced in these populations using pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic therapeutic modalities
- Collaborate and refer to other health providers as indicated
- Develop own role as an FNP primary health care provider within clinical settings

Placements: primary care, correctional facility, public health, women's health, men's health, emergency room, urgent care, specialty rotation (dermatology, cardiology, pulmonology, orthopedics, urology/nephrology, endocrinology, behavioral health, hospitalist (limited))

Skills: nail resection/removal, splinting/casting, I & D of minor abscess, digital block, joint aspiration, joint injection, foreign body removal, eye irrigation with Morgan lens, ear irrigation/cerumen removal, fluorescein stain (eye), woods lamp use, spirometry, subungual hematoma release, reduction of nursemaid's elbow/reduction of minor finger/toe dislocations (with supervision), ABIs, orthostatic BP, suturing, shave biopsy, punch biopsy, cryotherapy, wart removal, Nexplanon removal/insertion (needs certification), IUD removal/insertion (needs certification).
