Rake-a-Difference and Other Upcoming Events

A letter from UHP Acting Director Alex Bolinger

As you will see from reading this week's Weekly Update, there are a variety of great Honors events coming up in the next six weeks. They range from the Honors Halloween Party and Costume Competition later this week to the "Rise and Register" preregistration event on November 8th to a pair of Game Nights in November and December. I especially encourage you to save the date of December 3rd for a Winter Formal that promises to be decorated quite glamorously, in the style of the Yule Ball in Harry Potter. (I want to give a guick shout-out to your University Honors Club student leaders, who keep coming up with these incredibly creative, awesome ideas!)

The back end of any semester is usually very busy and these next six weeks will fly by, so I encourage you to make a commitment to carve out some time in your schedule for fun and fellowship. Please consider seeking out at least one or two of these events that interest you and fit into your schedule – not just because attending an event each semester is a requirement of the Honors Program, but more importantly as a way to help preserve the balance that is important in any student's life.

In terms of participating in an event that will allow you to have a significant positive impact on the most vulnerable members of our local community, nothing could be better than participating in Rake-a-Difference (Friday, November 12th and Saturday, November 13th). An ISU student originally dreamed up the idea for Rake-a-Difference eight years ago in response to the Make-a-Wish Challenge, where students in my Management classes organize in groups to come up with and carry out a fundraiser to raise money for children in our community who have faced a life-threatening medical situation.

The idea of raking the leaves of people throughout Pocatello and Chubbuck in exchange for donations to those in need was transferred to the Pocatello Free Medical Clinic and has been one of their primary fundraisers ever since. Remarkably, the Pocatello Free Clinic is one of the oldest free medical clinics in the entire United States and it relies primarily on volunteers from the community (e.g., including many Honors students who have interned at the Free Clinic over the past several years) and funding from grants, donations, and fundraisers to continue to provide medical and dental services.

Here is why your participation makes such an important difference: The Free Clinic has obtained a series of matching grants that only provide funding to match what the Free Clinic can raise. Thus, every dollar that gets raised during Rake-a-Difference will be matched by up to five dollars from grants, dramatically amplifying the impact of your work.

Last year, despite some snowy weather, 80 of you participated in Rake-a-Difference and contributed to a record fundraising effort of over \$18,000! This year, the long-range forecast is looking a lot sunnier (famous last words for anyone living in Idaho!) and we would like to up the ante. We are hoping that 100 Honors students will participate this year to help the Pocatello Free Clinic toward their goal of \$20,000 to meet the growing needs in our community during the pandemic.

When it comes to taking on a good challenge, I have no doubts about Honors students – after all, you all were pivotal in enabling the Honors Program to race past our goal of 400 gratitude letters during The Gratitude Challenge (we ended up with 521 letters during the month of September!). Thank you in advance for considering participating in Rake-a-Difference and some of the other great Honors events coming up in the next six weeks. I am also really looking forward to getting to see many of you face-to-face at our Bi-Annual Honors Meeting (BAHM) next week. (Be sure to take a moment to sign up for your preferred BAHM meeting time, if you have not already - spoiler alert: there is nothing guite like the Friday 7:00 a.m. time, in case you're wondering...)

Honors Envoy

Envoy members support Honors Leadership, are deeply involved in UHP work and recruitment, and become the face and representative of the UHP and its student members. There are typically five Envoy positions available every Fall and Spring semester.

As an internship position, Envoy positions are semester-long terms (available each Fall and Spring semester) and include a \$300 scholarship and a stipend of approximately \$300 (at \$9 per hour, paid over the semester).

Honors Mentors provide Honors students a resource on campus that they can rely upon to answer questions related to their education, the university, and even personal matters. Their knowledge of ISU campus resources and professional training offer new Honors students with a reliable advocate for a successful college experience.
