HONORS OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

These scholarships, **up to \$250**, are intended to help UHP students with specific academic costs that are not covered by tuition. Requests include, but can extend beyond, course textbooks, materials, supplies, and fees; test fees (e.g., GRE, MCAT, Praxis); graduate school application fees; musical instrument maintenance; commuting costs; or research materials. The Opportunity Scholarships will be presented to potential donors online and on handmade flower ornaments (see below) at the **Opportuni-Tea on April 4th!**

First step: Check out the application criteria in [BOSS](#).

Then, consider the following tips:

1. The **more specific** your request, **the better!** Potential donors like to know what specific items (and their costs) you're hoping to fund.
2. Your request can be **any amount up to \$250**. In fact, many donors like to have a variety of cost options to choose from.
3. Your personal statement should be brief and concise. Make sure you're telling potential donors **what you need AND how it will help you** achieve your educational or professional goals.

Applications close at the **end of the day on Saturday, February 28!**

Apply for Honors Scholarships in BOSS by February 28

SDS Scholarship

For 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year continuing, full-time, active status Honors students who have a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.2. Applicants will be asked to describe ways in which they are involved in the Honors Program beyond fulfilling regular Honors attendance and program requirements.

Heithoff Scholarship

For 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year continuing, full-time, active status Honors students who have a cumulative GPA between 2.90 and 3.90; working a part-time job; volunteering, mentoring, or assisting others; and have scholarships or grants that total to less than 75% of the costs of ISU's tuition and room and board.

Bobette Wilhelm Memorial Scholarship

Available to full-time continuing, active status Honors students with a minimum GPA of 3.2. A 1-2 page essay explaining how you are using your academic, extracurricular, and professional experiences to address an issue (e.g. economic, social, political, education, health, environmental, etc.).

Lookout Credit Union Scholarship for Community Service

Available to full-time continuing, active status Honors students with a minimum GPA of 3.2. A 1-3 page personal statement describing your commitment to serving the Southeast Idaho community is required.

Lookout Credit Union Scholarship for Excellence in Business

Available to full-time continuing, active status Honors students with a minimum GPA of 3.2 and majoring or minoring in Business. A 1-3 page personal statement describing your career goals in the field of Business and how you are working to achieve these goals is required.

Idaho Central Credit Union Perseverance Scholarship

Available to full-time continuing, active status Honors students with a minimum GPA of 3.2. Applicants must submit a one page personal statement describing a specific adversity or challenge that you are currently struggling with or have recently overcome.

Opportunity Scholarship

Available to full-time, active status Honors students with a minimum GPA of 3.2. Applicants may request a specific scholarship amount of \$250 or less to be used for a specific academic need and provide a short bio that will be available to donors online and during the UHP annual fundraiser, An Opportuni-Tea.

Sustainable Idaho Radio Show Host GPI

Sustainable Idaho, an award-winning weekly radio show on KISU, will be seeking new student host interns starting this summer. The program interviews a wide variety of sustainability experts on topics that are of current interest to ISU students, faculty, and community members. The show's aim is to provide eastern Idaho with a quality radio show that brings environmental and sustainability issues into everyday conversations. Hosts work every week with professionals from the Portneuf Resource Council to decide on topics, write questions, arrange and hold interviews, edit the recorded interview with professional equipment, and revise their drafts after feedback. No experience necessary--student hosts will receive training--but an interest in sustainable topics is a must.

This position is funded through the Career Path Internship program at **\$13/hour**. To be eligible, students should be prepared to train over the summer and then be available for a **10 hour per week** commitment during the academic year. Summer Authentic Research Experiences (SARE)

Summer Authentic Research Experiences (SARE) is designed to engage Idaho undergraduates in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields related to I-CREWS research and increase the number and preparation of skilled scientists and engineers in I-CREWS fields (geosciences, biological sciences, social sciences, and resilience science, computational modeling, machine learning and artificial intelligence) to provide analytical outcomes to proactively address the impacts of meteorological, population, and technological change on energy-water (E-W) systems.

Each student receives hands-on, paid (up to \$6,000) summer research experiences (full-time or part-time educational opportunities available), where they study topics broadly related to the I-CREWS project. Each SARE educational opportunity is designed as a learning experience and not employment.

Students participating in SARE will be expected to present research results at the Idaho Conference on Undergraduate Research (ICUR) in July 2026, as well as the Idaho NSF EPSCoR Annual Meeting. Students will be expected to participate in a virtual Summer Research Community, hosted by Boise State University, and network with other students in the SARE program. Students will also be required to submit a research profile to the Idaho EPSCoR website.


