Honors Thesis Spotlight:

Chachi Granados Gonzalez

"Your Path Doesn't Have to Look Like Someone Else's" A Photovoice Exploration of Honors Education



Working as a registered behavior technician, Chachi Granados Gonzalez, '25, has found her passion working with children and young adults. "I love helping my kiddos and watching their progress." After work, you can find her reading, hiking, and playing sports with friends – if it's outside in the sun, Chachi is right there!

After graduating this May with an Honors Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, Chachi plans to attend graduate school at the University of Washington to obtain a Master's in Clinical Psychology in their child and adolescent program. She plans to "continue helping others, especially young children and adults."

Chachi first learned about the Photovoice project when UHP Instructor/Coordinator Conner Suddick recruited her to be a participant. After participating in the project, Chachi was hooked! "Conner took me under his wing and was able to guide me and

teach me more about the methods and the continuation of the project." Chachi is grateful for Conner's continued guidance and support in the development of her thesis.

Chachi's thesis examines the experiences of 11 honors students using photovoice – a participatory action research method -- to examine factors that create barriers for students, particularly those from historically underrepresented backgrounds. Chachi interviewed the students using an audio recording device. She then transcribed the interviews and coded the transcripts using qualitative inductive coding, all by hand in the old school way! "With this approach to coding, themes emerge on their own as patterns and phrases are repeated. Four key themes emerged: imposter phenomenon, repayment, boundaries, and acknowledgement." Read her <u>full abstract here</u>.

Through her research, Chachi says that she "really enjoyed learning more about my methods through my mentor and how amazing of a tool it can be for marginalized groups to feel empowered and speak up. I think that by being able to not only continue the project, but also be a part of it, not only opened my eyes to the various stories that were similar to mine but also helped me form bonds with others that were very special."

When asked about tips for successful research, Chachi says, try to "not be afraid of going outside your comfort zones and taking on new challenges."


