Jason Overocker MMS, PA-C is a physician assistant who lives in Boise, Idaho and works at the Saint Alphonsus Level II trauma center, specializing in trauma and acute care surgery. Prior to working primarily in trauma, he worked in burn surgery, general surgery and orthopedic trauma surgery. As a trauma and acute care surgery physician assistant, he assists in providing care to critically sick and injured patients suffering from blunt and penetrating physical trauma as well as patients in need of emergent general surgery and critical care.

Nicole Wolter

Nicole graduated from the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities in Dec. 2019, where she earned a B.S. in Neuroscience. She started college as a pre-med student, but discovered a love of biological research while completing her honors thesis. She conducted undergraduate research developing synthetic peptide biosensors to detect kinase activity. Given this, she decided to pursue a dual MD/PhD degree program, applying during her last semester of college and joined the Tufts University School of Medicine Medical Scientist Training Program in June 2020. She has completed the first 2 years of medical school and is currently in her first year of PhD studies in the lab of Iris Jaffe, studying the interaction of the mineralocorticoid receptor and estrogen receptor in driving sex differences in cardiovascular disease for her graduate thesis.

She has experience in a variety of settings including pediatrics, rehabilitation, and acute care in the hospital setting.
