Nicole Wolter

Nicole graduated from the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities in Dec. 2019, where she earned a B.S. in Neuroscience. She started college as a pre-med student, but discovered a love of biological research while completing her honors thesis. She conducted undergraduate research developing synthetic peptide biosensors to detect kinase activity. Given this, she decided to pursue a dual MD/PhD degree program, applying during her last semester of college and joined the Tufts University School of Medicine Medical Scientist Training Program in June 2020. She has completed the first 2 years of medical school and is currently in her first year of PhD studies in the lab of Iris Jaffe, studying the interaction of the mineralocorticoid receptor and estrogen receptor in driving sex differences in cardiovascular disease for her graduate thesis.

Michelle Andrysiak has been practicing as an occupational therapist since 2016. She has experience in a variety of settings including pediatrics, rehabilitation, and acute care in the hospital setting. For the past five years, she has primarily worked in the hospital and prefers the more acute, fast paced environment. Honors Students:

Mentorship is needed, important, and fosters many benefits. A current honors student may gain a role model and a wise friend. An honors alumni mentor may form an additional friendship and help unlock the untapped potential of a rising leader in his/her field of study. Both can reap rich rewards as students learn from their mentors and alumni advance their own mentoring capabilities. Most importantly, mentorship gives current students and alumni the opportunity to establish meaningful connections. The AMPed UP! program does this.

The AMPed UP! program is designed with structure, but the flexibility to suit both the mentor's and student's needs. This self-paced program is accessible via the Honors website. You can schedule the 6 sessions anytime it works for both as long as the sessions are completed before April 24, 2023. Are you interested in becoming a student mentee? Please see the bios of the committed mentors for this semester and respond to this email with the mentor you would prefer to work with.

First, we have a 2018 graduate who completed an Honors Bachelor of Science in Biology and a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. She is currently working in clinical research as a Certified Clinical Research Coordinator for Frenova Renal Research. She is hoping to continue her education through the PA program at ISU. She is open to mentoring up to two students.

Second, we have a 2021 graduate who completed an Honors Bachelor of Arts in Marketing and Videography. She is currently working at a marketing agency called Rain the Growth Agency.
